A Family Story... breaking cycles of poverty through Habitat

"I will be the first person in my family's history to own a home" said Emily Herring, mother of two and Habitat Partner Family with Chemung County Habitat. "Owning a home will be a personal achievement for me."

Emily was raised by a single mother and grew up in a low-income apartment complex, like her mother and grandmother before her. "We never had a big a back yard or any outdoor toys to play with because either they weren't allowed by the landlord or my mother didn't want them to come up missing," she said. Emily and her younger brother dreamed of having their own house with a trampoline or a swimming pool in the summer, but things just didn't work out that way. Emily's mother still lives in that same apartment complex. It's time to break that cycle, Emily said. "I want my children to have a different experience than I did."

Emily is laser-focused on her goal of homeownership. It's what drives her. She graduated from Elmira College with a degree in Early Childhood Development, and plans to

pursue a Master's degree. She worked full time with the same organization for more than 13 years and recently achieved her dream job of becoming an elementary school teacher!

She is mother to an 9-yr-old daughter and a 2-yr-old son.

Somehow she finds a few hours a week to put in her "sweat equity" hours at a Habitat build site. She wants to be a role model for her daughter and show her that she can be a homeowner someday, too. "Giving my family a home we can call our own is something I'm determined to do."

Emily and her two children live in a rental house, and they endure living conditions that are far from adequate. Among a list of other issues, drafty doors and windows make it colder than it should be in the winter. "When the cold is more than we can stand, I pack up the kids and go stay with my mother." Emily taped a plastic tablecloth over one of the drafty doors, and it billows out like a parachute whenever the wind blows.

In addition to structural and interior breakdowns, there are feral cats living in the basement, creating a health hazard for her family. When the heat comes on in the winter or when it's hot in the summer, cat odors filter into their home. "My daughter suffers from allergies, so when the odors get too bad, it causes her allergies to flare up," Emily said. "It breaks my heart."

Emily says working with Habitat for Humanity is "one of the biggest blessings" for her and her family. "We are so happy and proud to belong to the Habitat family."




